




"I need to have a seamless space to walk around and spend my solitary times..." said our client Debaditya, a famous musician and owner of chain restaurant businesses. It was a terrace of a large duplex apartment divided into two parts by a rooftop room planned to be used as a seating lounge.

Checkers tiles were first choice for the entire flooring but planning to use wooden look tiles under the pergola and in the passage connecting both of the terraces have been a better choice to give a break to the monotonous feel.

There was a neighborhood building visible from a certain angle on the roof exactly where the pergola has been planned to be constructed. So it's been decided to maintain the shades of colours for the structures and other vertical surfaces in subdued hue to avoid the feel of imbalanced colour combinations against all vertical structures of neighborhoods visible from the roof. "Need to create a subtle ambience, not a high contrast look and feel" said Indiver, our senior designer just

after having a brief discussion with Debaditya on the topic of making concepts according to his taste and needs.

Also it was a really major issue for us to choose the proper breeds of plants as the preference was for all seasons floral plants with some palms and bamboos together.

Using glass fibre for creating wooden feel to the pergola structure was mainly to avoid maintenance issues and avoiding unnecessary headache of keeping original wooden structure intact from getting perished by weather conditions and insects. "It's better for my busy lifestyle as I need everything to be durable and easy to maintain" said Debaditya while discussing with us over list of materials to be used for the structures.

Same idea has been applied for the plants also by choosing breeds having capacity to withstand different weather conditions throughout the year and at the same time they add a serene look and feel to the place.
